Beautiful debutante VIVIAN MOLLISON was working toward her

Masters in Sociology. Her thesis — "a study of hierarchy in modern tribes", specifically motorcycle gangs. She gained the confidence of the DEATH STARS, an outlaw biker gang, and on a weekend road trip, her Sociological study turned into a study in terror. The Death Stars sold her to another biker gang who drugged her, sexually abused her and left her little more than a vegetable.

With Vivian barely comprehensible, the leader of the DEATH STARS no longer alive and a distinct lack of evidence and clues, Vivian's mother, socialite, MARGE MOLLISON, hires Rafferty to track down the biker thugs who destroyed her daughter's life. She doesn't want them getting off on some loophole. She wants them dead. But Rafferty has a rule against murder for hire.

THE INVESTIGATION.....

With the help of an old crony at police headquarters,
Rafferty tracks down the former girlfriend of one of the
Death Star bikers. FRAN ZIFRETTI is a stripper at a biker
bar. But she's trying to turn her life around. Her dream is
to have a real job, a good family and a house in the suburbs.

Rafferty is a sucker for the underdog and takes an immediate liking to Fran. Hanging out at the bar, asking too many questions, Rafferty gets into a confrontation with GOOSE, a huge, slimy pot bellied biker. Rafferty deliberately provokes Goose and they agree meet in a neutral alley where they can have a "fair fight."

RAFFERTY'S RULE #8 -- "There's no such thing as a fair fight".

Goose drives into the alley, steps off his bike and before he can say "brass knuckles" Rafferty puts several shot gun blasts through the biker's beloved Harley. Then, he shoots the stunned Goose in the ankle and sends him hopping home with the warning, "Tell the Death Stars I'm investigating the Vivian Mollison case"

RAFFERTY'S RULE #6 -- "Raising hell is a basic fact finding technique".

Rafferty explains to his girlfriend, sexy antique dealer HILDA GARDNER that his provocational tactics cut down on the leg work in an investigation. "Now, I won't have to look for them, the Death Stars'll come looking for me."

And it doesn't take long for that to happen. A few days

later, coming out of the strip joint, Rafferty is surrounded by 3 bikers. Two more charge out of the building, guns drawn, and just when it looks like Rafferty's going to become a permanent part of the landscape, a pick-up driven by cowboy roars into the parking lot, cutting off the bikers. Then another pick-up races down the street crashing into a row of bikes. Cowboy's rifle-wielding wife Mimi is behind the wheel. Shots ring out in every direction.
