13 features entered for film awards

TORONTO — (CP) — Thirteen features, eight in English and five in French, have been entered in the annual Canadian Film Awards competition.

The entries suggest that the Canadian Film Development Corp., a federal government creation which has \$10,000,000 to lend to producers, is helping Canadian feature films get a foothold. Last year, not one feature intended for movie theatre release was entered for the awards.

Presentations will be made here Oct. 3.

Among the entries are Goin' Down the Road, the tale of two Nova Scotia drifters, attracting large audiences

here and in Ottawa, Montreal and Vancouver; Act of the Heart with Genevieve Bujold as a convent girl who falls in love with Don Sutherland, and Homer, a story about a youth growing up.

Others are: The Last Act of Martin Weston, a psychological thriller made in Prague; Wow and A Matter of Fact, both by the National Film Board; Initiation, a sexploitation flick by the makers of Valerie and which has earned back its investment in Quebec alone, and Love In a Four Letter World, which was filmed in Montreal.
